A board certified pediatrician, he graduated from Tufts Medical School in 1979 and completed his residency training at Children's Hospital, San Francisco in 1983. He was named one of Boston magazine's Top Docs™ in Pediatrics in 2017, 2018, 2019 and most recently in 2020. Dr. Brown is the father of six grown children and 2 grandchildren.
